2005 COACHES MESSAGE

Here we are again, twelve months later, celebrating another season. At this time last year, we left the 2004 banquet with numerous questions. How would we adapt to moving into the realm of the big schools? How would we handle the expectations and pressures that come with being a defending state champion? In the end, it really came down to one question. How would the 2005 Titans grow the *Titan Tradition* and continue to foster the idea of “*Valuing Excellence*” as the foundation of this program.

Well once again, it is obvious that they have done this in spectacular fashion both on and off of the field of play. In jumping two classifications in size, the Titans simply went 17-1 and won the 2005 Maryland Class 3A State Championship! The Titans girl’s soccer team is now six for six, as they have won every possible Title that they competed for (2 Conference, 2 Regional, and 2 State Titles). They have very simply produced the most successful beginning to any soccer program in state history. While this level of excellence on the field of play is exciting, it is their performance in all that they do that truly speaks to the quality of each and every student-athlete in this room. While carrying an incredibly heavy course load filled with AP and Honors level courses, the entire girl’s soccer program completed the 1st term with a combined 3.45 GPA. If we took the time to weight this GPA, the numbers would be through the roof. It is no coincidence that this group of young ladies seems to succeed in all that they do. Very simply those individuals that truly “*Value Excellence*,” do so in all aspects of their life. It is this trait that is going to lead each and every one of these girls to find success in all endeavors that life brings their way.

This commitment to excellence has led the Titan’s girl’s soccer program to be recognized at the highest levels. In January 2006 in Philadelphia at the NSCAA Convention, the team will be honored at the national level for both their play on the field and performance in the classroom. The team will receive a plaque for finishing the 2005 season ranked in the National top 25 and a plaque for receiving the NSCAA National Team Academic Award for their performance in the classroom during the 2004-2005 school year.

From August 15th 2003, the day the program began, until now, the primary goal that the ladies have set for themselves has been to create the “*Titan Tradition*.” So what is the tradition that has been created here at Tuscarora? While winning games and championships are wonderful experiences, in the end they are fleeting moments. The true tradition is this idea of “*Valuing Excellence*.” It is this idea, guided by strong character and high standards and expectations, that enables the success that we have experienced to be possible. It is also these traits, inherent in this idea, which will allow one to overcome adversity, persevere, and find success on the other end. The 2005 Titans have upheld this tradition in a magical way.

On the field of play, the Titans run to the title was conducted in many ways. Throughout the year, the talent in this room shined as they not only won games, but did so with a quality of play that was creative and exciting to watch. This was a common refrain from opposing coaches, officials, and media throughout the year. This included the state final where both the officials and media from throughout the state simply stated this was the most enjoyable boys or girls team they have watched play all year. With that said a team must also demonstrate the fortitude and resolve to get through games in which the soccer was not where they would like it be. Where the opponent and situation created a game of intense emotion that ruled the game. For a team to become a champion it is essential that they show the ability to find their way through these types of games. The Titans did this in dramatic fashion as the playoffs moved forward. The passion and love that they have for the school, their own efforts, and most importantly for each other was exemplified in these games with the resolve that was demonstrated in the late stages of the playoffs. **Titan Pride** is obviously alive in well in the 2005 girl’s soccer team.
